
## Energy Solutions for Vancouver Island (Society) Annual General Meeting

He also is active on the International front, being recently appointed as the chair of the



Canadian Advisory Committee for IEC/ISO international standards work on Home Electronic Systems, with a focus on Smart Grid and Energy Management.

Ludo was our speaker last year. His presentation was fascinating and those present were rewarded. Don't miss him this year!
